## **Examples of Acceptable Social Security Number Verification**

- Social Security Card issued by the government (ie; not plastic or metal)
- Printout from the Social Security Administration (acknowledged by SSA if applicable)
- Medicare Card with any of the following codes: A, J1, J2, J3, J4, LM, M, M1, T, TA
- W2 form
- Form 1098 or 1099
- 401K statements or bank statements where earned income must be reported to the IRS
- Military ID
- Current pay stub
- Railroad Retirement Board card

## **Examples of Acceptable Date of Birth Exhibits Verification**

- State-issued Driver's License or ID card
- Birth Certificate
- Passport
- Letter from the Social Security Administration (acknowledged by SSA if applicable)
- Certificate of United States Naturalization (Form N-550 or N-570)

The easiest one would be the Social Security Letter which can be obtained by having the borrower go into their local Social Security Administration and having them print this letter with their birth date and Social Security # on it. The letter must be signed by the rep of the SSA. It can be done within a few minutes and can be faxed or scanned to us.
